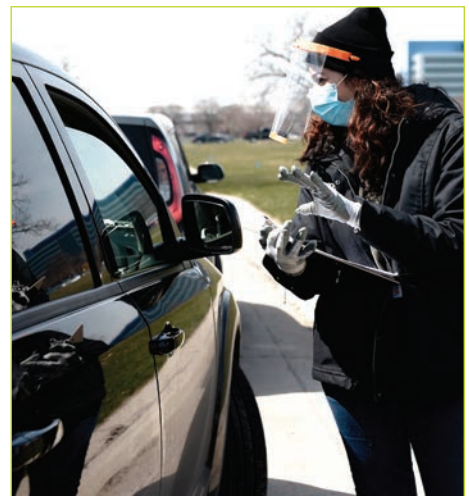

2019-2020 ANNUAL REPORT

Dear Friends and Supporters,

Thank you for your ongoing support of Forgotten Harvest. We are extremely grateful!

It cannot be overstated how challenging the past year has been. Nobody had a “How To” for dealing with the COVID-19 global outbreak. Many people were forced to shelter in place, others were laid off and without income. Forgotten Harvest was designated as an essential business and asked by our community to serve as a first responder during the crisis.

In order to quickly respond to this crisis, Forgotten Harvest collaborated with local nonprofit, government, and community leaders to implement critical contingency plans to deliver emergency food in the most effective and safest way possible. With the closure of businesses and schools, the economic impact of this unprecedented situation rapidly increased food insecurity by more than 50% for thousands of children, families, and seniors throughout metro Detroit. In many cases, emergency food lines doubled or tripled at many pantries and food distribution sites across southeast Michigan.

Forgotten Harvest mobilized quickly to get food out to the community by establishing additional mobile distribution sites, operating out of additional warehouses to allow for more storage and safe distancing during preparation of emergency food boxes, and packing school lunches in our warehouse to disburse to families impacted by school closures.

The team has been busy fulfilling our mission and adjusting to the changing economic and emotional impact the COVID-19 pandemic has had on the children, families, and seniors we serve. We are proud of our accomplishments and excited to share more about our impact. Please take time to read about how we serve the community through the voices of the many people who drive our mission – and thank you again for your support.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE

FIGHTING HUNGER & FOOD INSECURITY IN METRO DETROIT

FORGOTTEN HARVEST FEEDS THOUSANDS OF FAMILIES WHO HAVE LIMITED RESOURCES. SO LIMITED, THAT EVEN THE MOST BASIC NECESSITY OF FOOD IS SOMETHING THEY WORRY ABOUT. THIS IS BEFORE OUR COMMUNITY WAS HIT BY COVID-19. THE PANDEMIC CAUSED PANIC BUYING, TEMPORARY LAYOFFS, AND WAGE REDUCTIONS. THESE FACTORS CAUSED RECORD NUMBERS OF PEOPLE TO TURN TO US FOR HELP. MANY WHO HAVE NEVER NEEDED OUR ASSISTANCE BEFORE. FORGOTTEN HARVEST RAPIDLY WENT INTO ACTION AND CHANGED MANY OF OUR OPERATIONS.

CLIENT SERVICES

Many of our food pantry partners are coordinated by senior volunteers, and have been forced to close in order to limit COVID-19 exposure. In response, Forgotten Harvest established 17 On The Go mobile pantry distribution sites in areas of specific need through metro Detroit. Through these sites and other open pantry partners, we were able to continue to deliver millions of pounds of nutritious food in family sized boxes along with, protein, fresh produce, dairy, and supplemental lunches for kids.

Additionally, we were pleased to begin working with more than 15 new pantry partners throughout Wayne, Oakland, and Macomb counties. Our staff coordinated the distributions at the additional mobile pantry supersites until a group was found to coordinate volunteers and establish the pantry on an ongoing full time basis.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

We are so grateful for the increased support received during 2020. Many new and dedicated donors provided critical operating funding during a period when our organization's expenses increased dramatically responding to our community's demand for emergency food. This support also included additional temporarily donated warehouse space and vehicle and driver fleet resources. Many local municipal governments were in regular communication with our organization to provide additional safety, security and logistical assistance whenever needed.

BONNIE, OAK PARK

Bonnie and her family received food from Forgotten Harvest at the Oak Park On the Go Mobile Pantry super site. "Since this pandemic started," she said, "it's been very much a struggle for my family to put food on the table and make ends meet. My husband Jimmy owns and operates his own collision body shop - and with not that many people on the road, there's not many accidents so there's been no work. So we haven't had any business at the shop since the shutdown. With no money coming in, I still have to provide for my family."

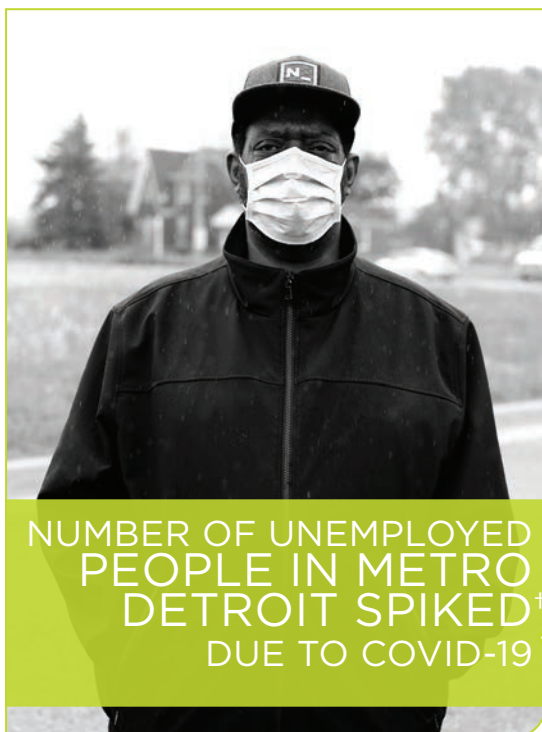
When Bonnie found out about Forgotten Harvest's weekly distributions, she started receiving food to help feed her kids. "They come first," she said. "I don't want them to ever feel what it's like to go hungry."



VOLUNTEERS

Our volunteers are critical to our work all year round. This past year we were adversely affected by the pandemic, and saw our volunteer numbers drop 90%. We quickly adjusted our volunteer experience protocols following strict guidelines from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the State of Michigan, and local dept of health. This response effort enabled individuals and small groups of dedicated and heroic volunteers to help us repack and distribute emergency food at our warehouses and our mobile pantry sites so that the flow of emergency food never stopped to the community.

A special THANK YOU to the Air National Guard stationed at Selfridge Air National Guard Base who have given their time to Forgotten Harvest when we had the fewest number of volunteers. Without them, the organization would have had to suspend operations.



OMAR, DETROIT

“ I live in Detroit, in the Mackenzie neighborhood. I happen to be on hard times, like many right now, and I needed some food for my family. I came to the Forgotten Harvest On The Go Mobile Pantry location last week to get help and receive some food. I heard about the food being given away at the Detroit Institute of Arts mobile pantry site, and I was amazed how much food I received for myself and my family. We were able to feed ourselves for the next two weeks.

I appreciate all Forgotten Harvest does in the city, and I hope others are able to get the food they need during this very difficult time. I am out of work right now and have been since the very beginning of the pandemic. It's been very hard. It's terrible, one day you have a job and the next you are out of work and struggling not only to make ends meet but to just feed your family. I am not alone, there are

a lot of people without jobs and they desperately need something. It's very hard out here right now. To be honest, because of the help I am getting from Forgotten Harvest, I've been able to take care of myself and my family.

KIMBERLY, DETROIT

Kimberly W. lives in the Dexter area of Detroit and has received food for her family at a Forgotten Harvest On the Go Mobile Distribution site.

“You have so many families that are struggling with people being laid off, kids staying home, not receiving food at school. It’s a hardship for everyone. My husband has been affected by this virus. He lost his job and was the main breadwinner for our family. It’s been hard. I am hoping he’s able to go back to work soon....We’ve really been trying to save money during this



whole outbreak, by buying less when we shop at our local grocery store. We still go once a week, but we definitely only buy things we really need and that will last our family for a couple weeks.

The boxes Forgotten Harvest gives out provide us with meats and fruits that are relatively pricey for some families now, so this all helps us out, buying a little bit at the store and using what we get from you, we can prepare a healthy meal.”

AGENCY PARTNERS

FORGOTTEN HARVEST AND OUR PANTRY PARTNERS IN SOUTHEAST MICHIGAN ARE FACING UNPRECEDENTED DEMAND. THE PANDEMIC HAS LED TO SWIFT AND WIDESPREAD JOB LOSSES IN THE AREA, LEAVING SOME PEOPLE IN A POSITION WHERE THEY ARE STRUGGLING TO AFFORD FOOD FOR THE FIRST TIME. MEANWHILE, PEOPLE WHO HAD RELIED ON FOOD ASSISTANCE BEFORE THE PANDEMIC ARE SEEING LIMITED RESOURCES STRETCHED.

THE DEMAND FOR THE FOOD FORGOTTEN HARVEST SUPPLIES HAS INCREASED BY MORE THAN 50% AT MANY PANTRIES. THROUGH OUT METRO DETROIT, OUR PANTRY PARTNERS SERVE AS THE DISTRIBUTION NETWORK TO THE COMMUNITY THAT NEEDS THEM. THESE AGENCIES DID EVERYTHING THEY COULD TO STAY OPEN, BUT UNFORTUNATELY SOME WERE FORCED TO CLOSE TEMPORARILY.

TO CONTINUE THE FLOW OF FOOD, WE SET UP AN ADDITIONAL 17 FORGOTTEN HARVEST ON THE GO MOBILE PANTRY DISTRIBUTION SITES THROUGHOUT METRO DETROIT. WE HAVE ALSO MANAGED TO CONTINUE SERVING OUR REGULAR PANTRY PARTNERS WHOM HAVE REMAINED OPEN OR RE-OPENED THEIR DISTRIBUTION SITES.

SUMMARY AND ANALYSIS

Our operations were changed dramatically in fiscal year 2019-20 by the COVID-19 pandemic. To continue to provide emergency food to our community, we needed to locate new sources of food as our traditional supply chain suffered shut-downs and shortages. In addition, we created new distribution processes and practices to support our significantly expanded mobile pantry operations, secured and equipped additional warehouse and storage facilities that were necessary to operate in a safe manner, and changed practices throughout our organization to incorporate COVID-19 protocols. We accomplished all these things thanks to our tremendous team and supporters. However, all of these changes increased our normal operating costs by approximately \$236,000 per month, an expenditure level we expect to continue in fiscal 2020-21.

Thanks to our donors' substantial support for our COVID-19 crisis response plan, we ended our fiscal year with operating cash reserves at a higher than normal level. We have been expending these reserves to support and sustain our crisis response plan and operations, and we expect to continue to do so throughout fiscal 2020-21.

During early 2019-20, we initiated our Solutions That Nourish capacity campaign. We temporarily paused that campaign once it became apparent that our COVID-19 response would need all our attention. We plan to restart that campaign in 2020-21. During 2019-20, we received approximately \$2,565,361 of restricted capacity campaign contributions and commitments and we expended approximately \$1,602,000 of those restricted funds, principally for the purchase of land and initial costs associated with our new campus and warehouse facility.

SOLUTIONS THAT NOURISH CAMPAIGN OVERVIEW

Forgotten Harvest is quite proud of our nationally recognized, food recovery and distribution program and our leadership as an innovative, progressive, efficient and effective regional non-profit. To ensure we are maximizing our potential impact, we took on the challenge of a comprehensive strategic planning and self-assessment process. What Forgotten Harvest learned is that we can serve our community even better by improving upon a few fundamental areas affecting hunger and food insecurity – ACCESS & SUPPLY of Food, and FOOD EQUITY – so that every child, family, and senior can regularly receive a diverse, nutritious mix and appropriate volume of food.

A CAMPAIGN FOR INNOVATION, FOOD EQUITY, AND ACCESS

To address these areas, Forgotten Harvest utilized a planning grant from The Kresge Foundation to undertake: 1) a comprehensive mapping of metro Detroit's core food system to re-evaluate current access and supply for food-insecure residents, and 2) an extensive review of our logistics, warehousing, and distribution services to be sure we are making operational course corrections needed to align operations with our new scale of distribution. We also recently launched a visionary new client intake tool at our partner agencies to better measure number of households served, assess health-related and other socioeconomic factors, and client needs to better determine food volumes and nutritional mix. The goal is to ensure the best service to our recipient agencies and the optimal mix of nutritious food for our community's food-insecure residents.

The successful completion of this campaign will significantly improve Forgotten Harvest's operational capacity and fiscal responsibility by:

- Improving fleet utilization, food handling, and throughput;
- Maximizing donor dollars by rescuing more food (est. 69 million pounds per year) while maintaining a 19-20 cent per pound cost
- Better utilizing demographic data to improve food insecurity in our community
- Improving volunteer utilization and capacity

Most importantly, improved operational capacity will result in significant long-term impacts for the metro Detroit community, including:

- Healthier, more nutritious mix of food for food-insecure families and seniors
- Increased distribution to under served communities
- Enhanced volunteer experience
- Improved service, quality, and reliability to partner agencies
- More equitable distribution to food-insecure residents in our community
